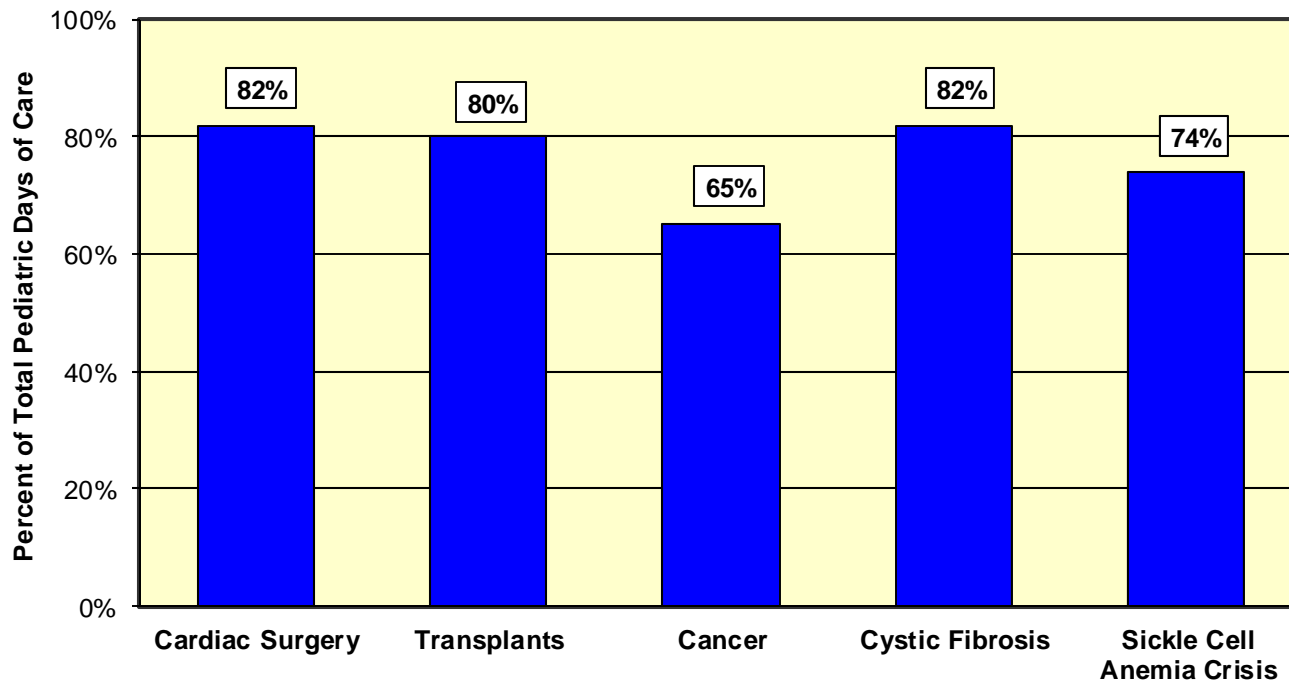

\* Under age 18.

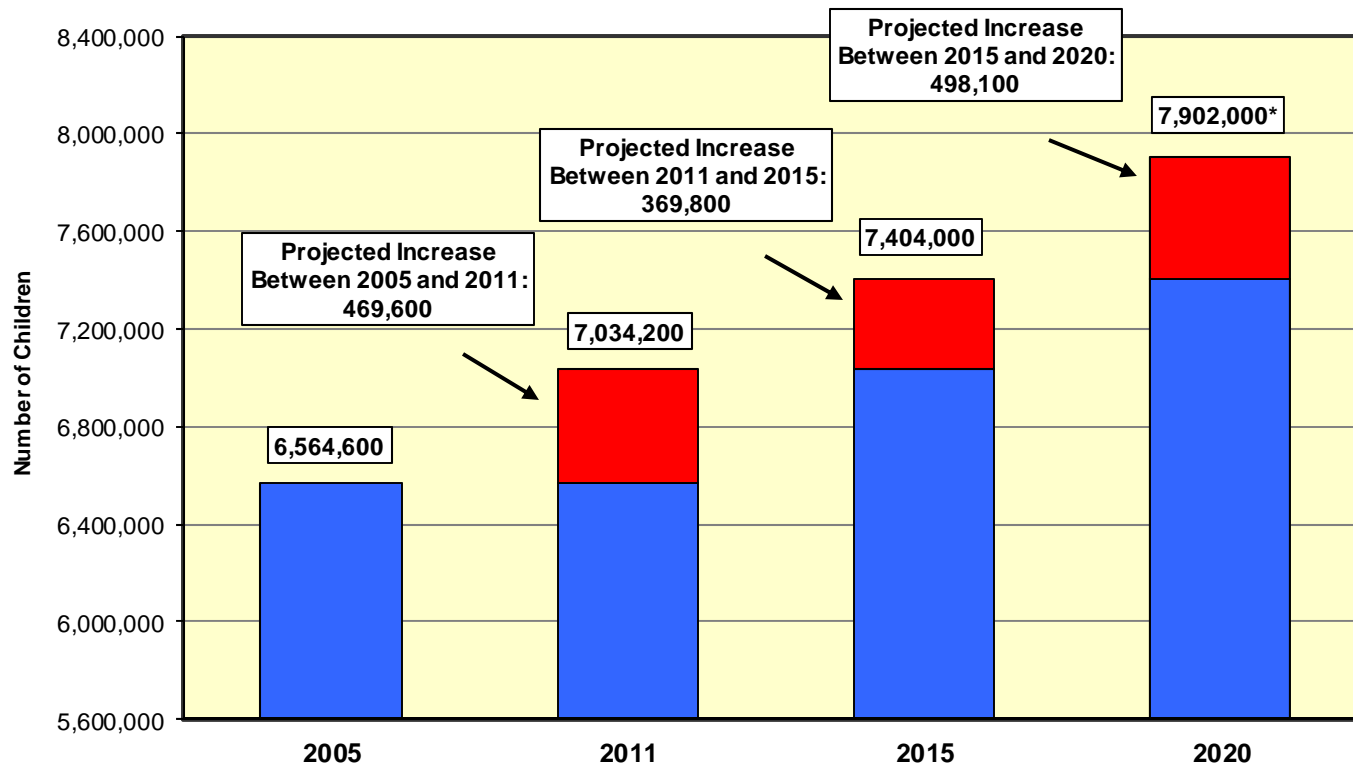

# Projected Growth in the Number of Children Under 19 Years of Age Texas 2011, 2015 and 2020

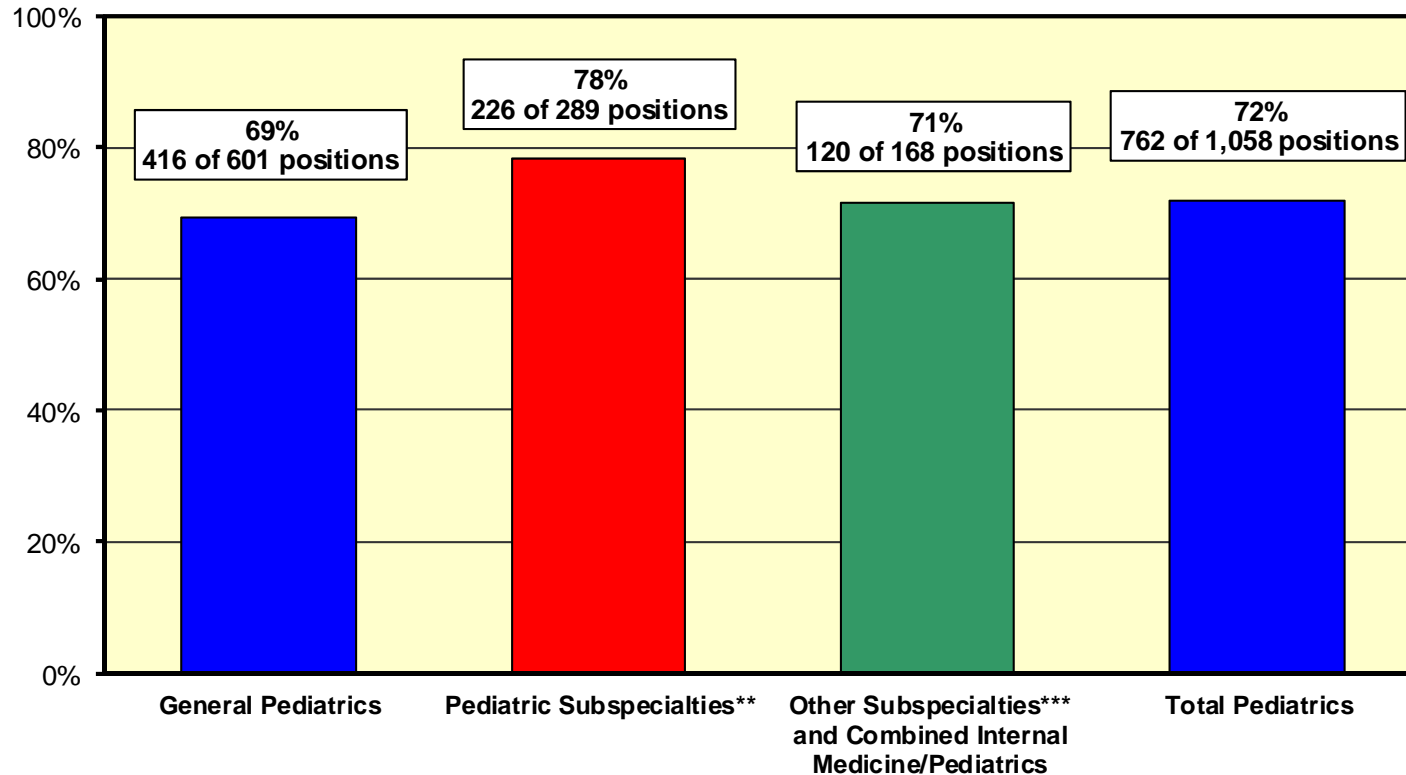

\*Includes all rotations of any length noted for CHAT member hospitals.

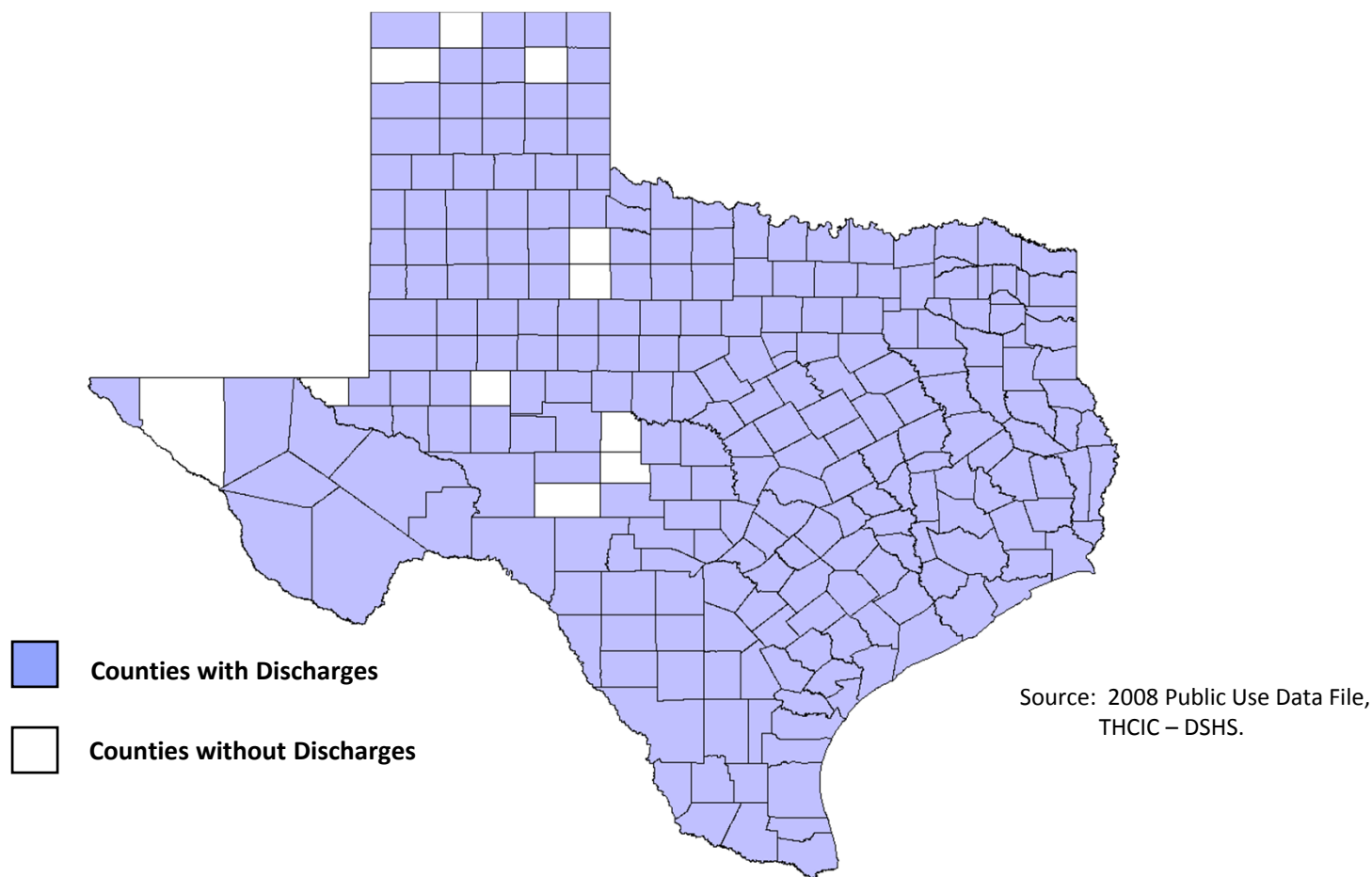
